

1st Annual Giant Pride Day

Who: School organizations, teams, or informal groups of students who have a teacher sponsor/supervisor

What: A day of service to the school. Each group will plan and carry out a service project for the improvement of WHS. Participation is optional; alternatives will be available for those who don't want to play (Friday Night School, exam review or make-up work study halls, reading room, etc.—details coming).

Some Ideas:

- Polish trophies in the cases
- Build a new trophy case or create a new display for recently earned trophies
- Create a WHS Veterans' Memorial
- Create a plaque/display of all WHS valedictorians
- Create a "History of WHS" webpage for the school website
- Design and paint a mural on a blank wall
- Plant a garden
- Weed/clean up an existing garden
- Create a summer bulletin board display

- Spruce up the courtyard
- Clean graffiti off bathroom doors
- Help a teacher clean out/organize a public, storage, or office area
- Paint/spruce up the press box
- Create a new art gallery space/display
- Update name/subject labels for classroom doors
- Powerwash the sidewalks
- Small repairs
- Frame mission statements/honor statements for classrooms

Feel free to come up with your own ideas!! Consider the talents, skills, and resources of your group and submit a proposal! Plan for a project that can be completed in about 2-1/2 hours. Remember to plan for any necessary preparation ahead of time.

Cost: We are asking groups make to small contributions as they are able to a Giant Pride Day fund. The SGA has committed to matching those contributions up to \$500. Groups can then make requests for financial aid from the Giant Pride Day fund in order to cover costs. It will be important to consider the budget for your proposed idea, and to stay at or under that budget once the proposal is accepted.

When: **June 2, 2010**—after the Honors Assembly. (Conveniently, also after SOL tests, between re-takes, and just in time for graduation!) **Please submit your proposal by Wednesday, May 12.**

Why: To provide an opportunity for student leadership & service.
To provide students with a way to give back to the school.
To provide formal or informal groups a chance for an end-of-year celebration and final team-bonding activity
To provide WHS with some low-cost, spirit-boosting improvement!
